WHY GIRL SCOUT CAMP?

Girl Scouts is the largest all girl organization and everything we do is designed to create an environment where girls can learn and grow together and become leaders in their daily lives. We strive to build girls of courage, confidence and character who make the world a better place. When girls go to camp, either on their own or with an adult partner, they explore leadership in a new way. At camp girls build life skills, responsibility and healthy habits while developing a deep appreciation for nature. Girl Scout camp provides a caring environment led by trained adults who help girls call the shots. Their dreams are our dreams, and we're going to have a blast making them come true.

Camp Skyland Ranch is located in the San Jacinto Mountains on the Banning side and is owned and operated by Girl Scouts of San Gorgonio Council. Skyland Ranch is located at an elevation of a little over 5000 feet and overlooks the Morongo Valley. The sprawling camp setting in this chaparral environment allows many open spaces for campers to find themselves and connect with nature and other girls. For over 70 years, thousands of girls have experienced the magic that is Camp Skyland Ranch.

Camp Skyland Ranch is open to all girls in Kindergarten through 12th grade. Camp is designed to give every girl the chance to succeed, build friendships, challenge herself, build self-esteem, leadership skills and have fun. Highlights of the camp programs include archery, arts and crafts, nature, horse-back riding (for girls who sign up for it), camp skills, fencing, games, drama, outdoor recreation, campfires, fun and more! Just pick the theme week that is right for you and your camper.

Horse Camp

@ horse camp girls spend 4-6 hours at horses each full day. Girls will ride, interact with and care for the horses and get to participate in some other camp programs. Weather may affect horse activities. Campers must be 4th grade and older.

Horsin' Around

June 19-23, July 10-14, July 24-28

Play with your new camp friends while you learn the basics of horse care.

Stable Days

July 17-21

Enjoy taking the next step in activities as you participate with other experienced riders and look at horses. Girls must have already attended horse camp or lessons.

GIRL LEADERSHIP VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Girls attend these on their own. Transportation from Redlands is provided. An application, interview process and in-person pre-training are required. \$400 for 5-day;

LIT (Grades 8-10)

Space is limited for this program this year. Select girls will work alongside camp counselors as they start to take a leadership role in camp.

CIT1 (Grades 10-12) CIT2 (Grades 11-12)

Go a step further than LIT and earn the Counselor-In-Training (CIT) recognitions through a variety of requirements that help you gain skills as camp counselor and learn about camp as an industry. CIT1 must be completed before CIT2. CIT1 has no prerequisite.

Take advantage of this opportunity to spend time with your favorite campers. All the My Favorites include fun camp activities like archery, hiking, arts, fencing, crafts and more. All participants must be Girl Scout members prior to attendance. Adults are responsible for their own girls except at the My Favorite Guy the camp staff will be responsible for bed time and overnight hours. Choose the type of My Favorite weekend that is right for you. Girls must attend with an adult. Horses includes at least an interactive horse experience which includes a 15 minute trail or arena ride depending on comfort level and age of the participant and weather.

How to register for camp

AS EASY AS 1 – 2 – 3 – 4

Every girl deserves Girl Scout Camp; as it is a safe all girl environment for girls to improve responsibility and other life skills.

1. Talk to your camper to choose the dates or theme
2. Visit the event calendar and pick A camp
3. Click the “Register” button to complete the forms to register
4. Pay the \$60 Deposit; then pay balance 3 weeks prior to camp.

Girls select program based on age and desire. Girls are then placed in program groups based on theme. Some activities are done as

a cabin and others as an age group.
All programs are based on weather.

WHAT IS DAY CAMP? It is fun filled days out of doors at Camp Wi-Wo-Ca located in the Wildwood Canyon of Yucaipa. There are many activities to do, such as crafts, games, hikes, nature study, outdoor cooking and more. Day camp is a great way to learn camping skills.

- Wi-Wo-Ca Day Camp is a 5 day program. Please do not register your daughter for camp if you know she will not be able to attend all 5 days.
- Girls must register individually, no troop or group registrations will be accepted.
- Registration closes Wednesday, May 24, 2023. Electronic confirmation with additional information will be e-mailed the middle of June.

FEE: \$150 PER CAMPER. This includes a T-shirt, hat, unit picture, patch, beads, crafts, snacks and most of the meals.

Volunteers Needed!

PLEASE consider volunteering to work at camp as a full-time unit leader or assistant leader. Remember full-time adult volunteers are guaranteed a space for their daughter(s), and their daughter(s) attend for \$75! Full fee of \$150.00 is due at registration, \$75.00 refund will be processed after camp is concluded.

Note: Senior and Ambassador Girl Scouts who qualify to work as program aides pay only \$75.

Skyland Ranch is a beautiful camp located in Banning on Highway 243, approximately 20 minutes from the 10 freeway. The programs combine education, outdoor immersion, and career exploration. Through fun and innovative methods students engage in STEM curriculum while learning to be stewards of the environment. The students are learning in the great outdoors and for many it is their first time to experience the mountains and wilderness. Grant funding is available for qualifying programs and schools.

Outdoor Adventures

There's no limit to the amount of adventure and fun your students can have when they spend the day at Camp Skyland Ranch. From archery (aerodynamics) to outdoor skills to astronomy to crafts. This program offers amazing experiences and lots of excitement for all ages in an outdoor setting, providing a healthy environment to support students physical, emotional, and social development.

If you have older or younger students, wish to include an overnight or two, or simply want more input in your experience than this option is for you. OPTION 1: FREE

For title 1 schools **or** schools primarily serving low-income students we have some grant funding this year to cover some of our programs including buses. Therefore, the program can be low-cost to free for many schools in our area.

OPTION 2: PARTIAL FUNDING

For non-profits and schools with less than 60% of their students meeting low-income guidelines we offer financial aid either per student or to the overall cost. We are also willing to co-apply for grants (or be named in a grant). Sample pricing for a reduced rate program is below:

- \$450 for first 15 students & 2 teachers
- \$250 for each additional 10 students & 1 adult
- \$15/person for lunch add on

Does not include bus.

This is also a good option for schools wanting a 2 hour program..

OPTION 3: Fully Paid

For schools or groups not needing financial assistance the pricing is as follows:

- \$55/student
- 1 free chaperone per each 8 students

Does not include bus.

Includes lunch.
